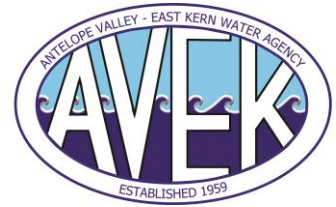




Shelley Sorsabal, President
